

KELSEY SHAWL

Skill Level: Easy

Materials

- US G (4.00 mm) crochet hook
- Size #3 DK weight yarn
 - 2 colors
 - A: 4.6 oz/ 488 yds
 - B: 4.4 oz/ 467 yds
- Notions: scissors, measuring tape, yarn needle

Gauge (blocked)

- 16 sts (see notes) x 15 rows = 4"

Terms/ Stitches Used

- Sk: Skip
- St: Stitch
- Ch: Chain
- RS: Right side
- Sc: Single crochet
- Dc: Double crochet
- Hdc: Half double crochet



Notes

- To create the gauge: Row 1: chain an even amount that will be wider than 4", sc into the 2nd ch from the hook and alternate dc/ sc across, ending on a dc. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc into the first dc, dc into the next sc and alternate sc/dc across. Repeat Row 2 until you have a height larger than 4" to measure.
- This pattern is worked from the point to the wider end in rows with a turn at the beginning of each row.
- The ch 1 at the beginning of each row does not count as a stitch.
- The row stitch counts increase one stitch per row, so the stitch count will be the same as the row number.
- This pattern is basically reversible but I did label a "right side" to make it easier to follow.
- The sample was made using Highland Wool from Hobbii in the colors 26 (color A) and 24 (color B).

Pattern Instructions

(RS) Row 1: A: Ch 2, sc into the second ch from the hook – 1 sc

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, hdc twice – 2 hdc

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, hdc twice into the first st, hdc once into the next st – 3 hdc

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, hdc once into the first 2 sts, hdc twice into the last st – 4 hdc

Row 5: Ch 1, turn, hdc twice into the first st, hdc across – 5 hdc

Row 6: Ch 1, turn, hdc into the first st, sc into the next st, dc into the next st, sc into the next st, hdc twice into the last st – 3 hdc, 2 sc, 1 dc

Row 7: Ch 1, turn, hdc twice into the first st, *sc into the next st, dc into the next st,* repeat from * to * until 1 st remains, hdc into the last st – 3 hdc, 2 sc, 2 dc

Row 8: Ch 1, turn, hdc into the first st, sc into the next st, *dc into the next st, sc into the next st,* repeat from * to * until 1 st remains, hdc twice into the last st – 3 hdc, 3 sc, 2 dc

Rows 9 - 22: Repeat Rows 7 - 8, a total of 7 more times.

Row 23: Repeat Row 7 once more – 3 hdc, 10 sc, 10 dc

Row 24: Ch 1, turn, hdc into the first st, ch 1, sk the next st, *hdc into the next st, ch 1, sk the next st,* repeat from * to * across until 1 st remains, hdc twice into the last st – 13 hdc, 11 ch 1

Row 25: Ch 1, turn, hdc twice into the first st, hdc into each st across (this counts both hdc and ch 1 spaces here and throughout) – 25 hdc

Rows 26 - 27: Repeat Rows 24 - 25 once more.

Row 28: Ch 1, turn, hdc into the first st, sc into the next st, *dc into the next st, sc into the next st,* repeat from * to * until 1 st remains, hdc twice into the last st – 3 hdc, 13 sc, 12 dc

Row 29: Ch 1, turn, hdc twice into the first st, *sc into the next st, dc into the next st,* repeat from * to * until 1 st remains, hdc into the last st – 3 hdc, 13 sc, 13 dc

Rows 30 - 45: Repeat Rows 28 - 29, a total of 8 more times.

Row 46 - 111: Repeat Rows 24 - 45, a total of 3 more times. Final st count on Row 111 is 3 hdc, 54 sc, 54 dc

Rows 112 - 114: Repeat Rows 24 - 26 once more.

Fasten off color A, Switch to color B.

Row 115: B: Repeat Row 25 once more – 115 hdc

Rows 116 - 123: Repeat Rows 28 - 29, a total of 4 more times.

Rows 124 - 127: Repeat Rows 24 - 27, once more.

Rows 128 - 135: Repeat Rows 28 - 29, a total of 4 more times.

Rows 136 - 139: Repeat Rows 24 - 27, once more.

Rows 140 - 147: Repeat Rows 28 - 29, a total of 4 more times.

Rows 148 - 151: Repeat Rows 24 - 27, once more.

Rows 152 - 159: Repeat Rows 28 - 29, a total of 4 more times.

Fasten off, weave in your ends. Block your shawl if necessary or desired.

Tassels

For each tassel: make 10 lengths of yarn at about 9" - 10" each. Cut another piece of yarn and tie it around the center of the bundle you just cut. Fold the bundle in half around the piece you just tied and using another piece of yarn, tie the two halves back into one. Attach each tassel to one of the points on your shawl. Feel free to steam block the tassels to get the yarn to lay evenly.
